Why do we read?

There are actually **two types of reading**. The most common type is **reading for information**. This is the reading that you do every day to complete tasks, such as:

In school, teachers are always telling us **we need to read more... but why?**

Why do we read?



The second type of reading is called **reading for fun**. This is when you read just because you want to – it makes you feel happier. It might look like:



Reading to **find out more** about a topic you're interested in.



Reading to **spend time with family or friends**.

Reading to **relax** or **escape** into a story.



Reading to **pass the time**, such as on a car journey

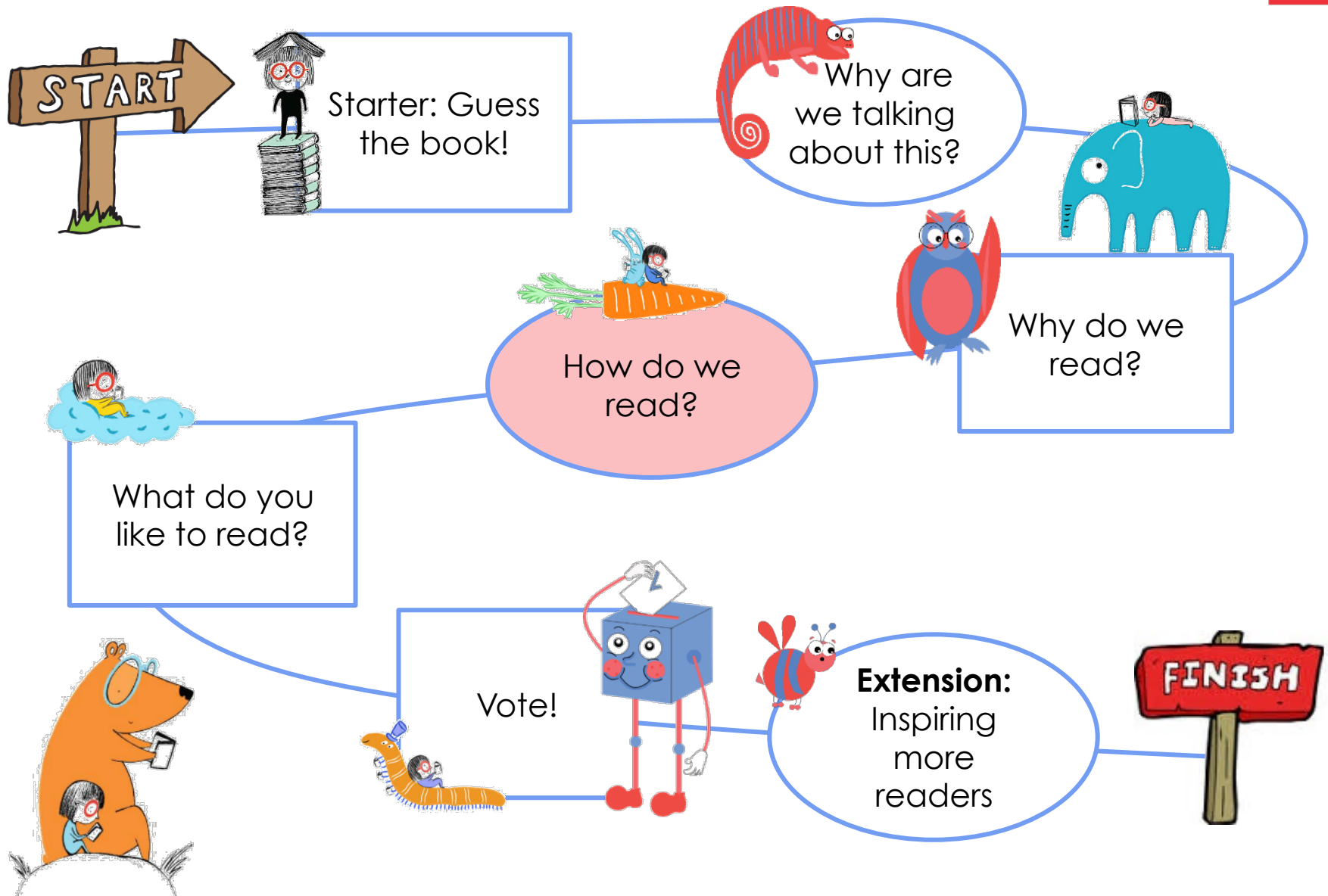

How do we read?



Before **electronics and screens**, what we read was either written by hand or done using a typewriter. However, **what we read today** now comes in lots of different **shapes and sizes**!

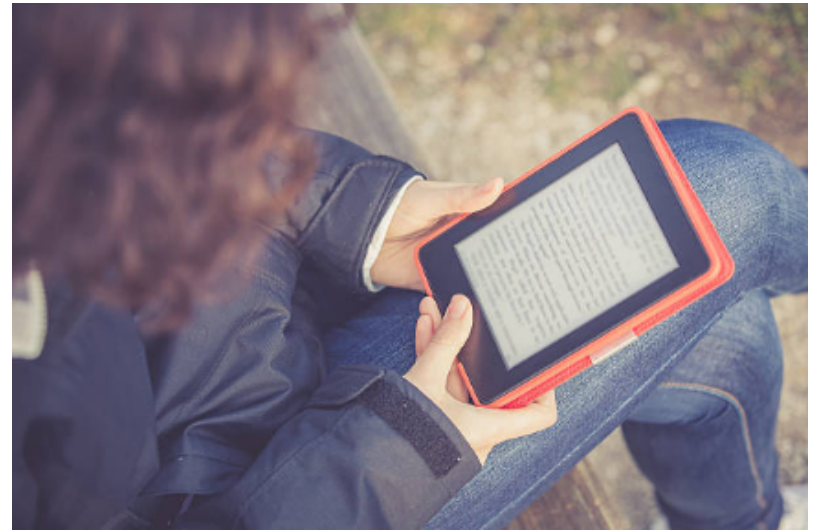

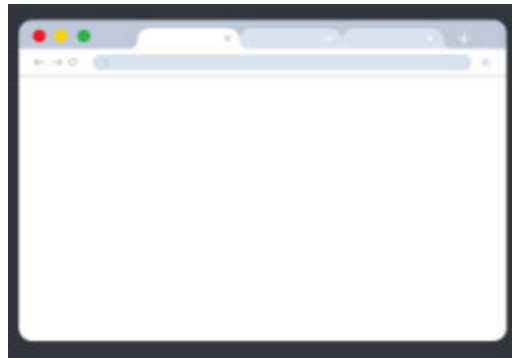
Another popular way to read is **reading online articles**. You might use these to **learn about something new**, **research** an interesting topic or to catch up on **the news**.

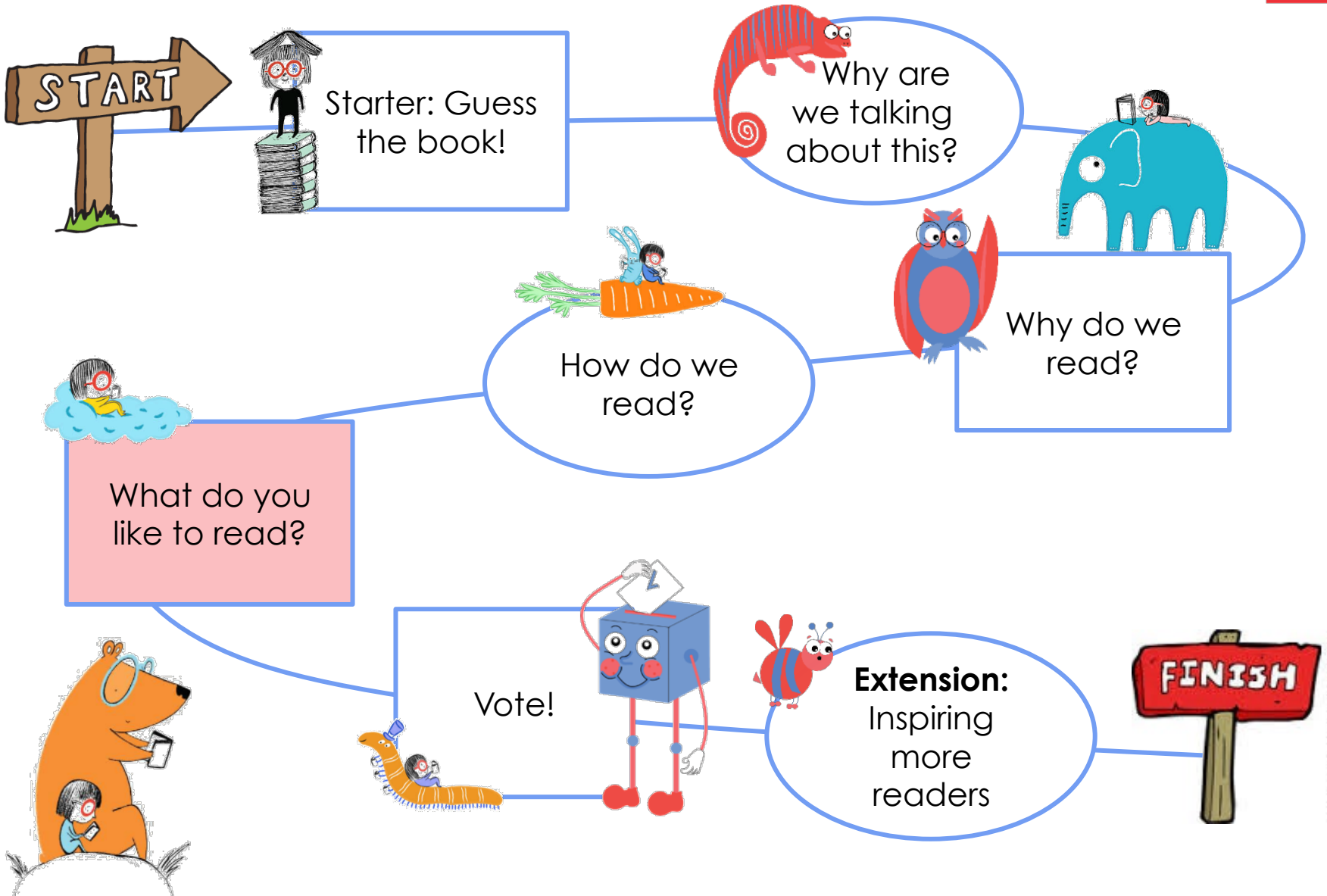

It is also easier for other people to **recommend books** to you!

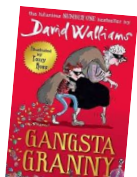
