# Why do we read?

There are actually **two types of reading.** The most common type is **reading for information.** This is the reading that you do every day to complete tasks, such as:

In school, teachers are always telling us **we need** to read more... but why?









The second type of reading is called **reading for fun.** This is when you read just because you want to – it makes you feel happier. It might look like:





It's this second type of reading – **reading for fun** – that we are going to be **talking** about today.




**True.** Adults who read for just **30 minutes** a week are **28% happier** with their life.


Take a look at these different ways of reading. For each one, stand up if you would enjoy reading this way and sit down if you don't think you would enjoy it. Not for me!

Many adults and children like **group** reading – you might take it turns to read out loud, or read silently then talk about what you have read. People who like reading this way might also join a book club!









A popular way to read is by using an e-reader. These devices can store hundreds of books on them and have changeable settings such as making the text bigger or reading in the dark.





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


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Another popular way to read is reading online articles. You might use these to learn about something new, research an interesting topic or to catch up on the news.







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
Hands up! (1 min) Put your hand up if you've ever spent ages looking for a book, then taken it home and realised that you didn't like it.


This happens to all of us sometimes, and it can be really annoying.

It is also easier for other people to **recommend books** to you!












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
