### CROSS COUNTRY RUNNING

The Cross Country season is upon us once again and the Waringham School cross country races will be held in February 2017. This event is held annually and boys and girls in Key Stage Two are entered from schools in London and Surrey. Each school team is allowed six runners to run but only the first four runners are able to score.

The boys and girls races will be seen repeatedly so there will be male and female winners in team and individual races. It is estimated that there will be over 100 runners in each race.

Any boy or girl who has not run cross country before, will find it challenging as the races are held in mid winter and we cannot control the weather conditions, but we will be holding cross country practise over on Tooting Bec Common in the coming months to acclimatise the runners and also find out who are our best runners.
